Now when Job's three friends heard of all these troubles that had come upon him, each of them set out from his home— Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite.

They met together to go and console and comfort him. When they saw him from a distance, they did not recognize him, and they raised their voices and wept aloud; they tore their robes and threw dust in the air upon their heads. They sat with him on the ground for seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great. ~Job 2:11-13

This text has become a foundational stone for my ministry because it shows powerfully a model of ministry we all can, and should, strive to emulate in our lives. It is the *ministry of presence*.

When Job's friends heard of what happening with him, they did what needed to do for their friend. They showed up, sat with him, and were present to Job. Their *ministry of presence* made it known to Job that even when life made him think God wasn't anywhere to be found, he was still not alone. Their *ministry of presence* made it known to Job that he was loved.

Job's friends didn't show up and start telling him everything was going to be ok. They didn't show up and give him some pithy pep talk in hopes of cheering him up. These friends didn't bring a casserole in an effort to replace <u>their</u> discomfort with comfort food. These friends simply showed up and permitted their presence to say, "We are here. You are not alone. We love you."

That has been a model of ministry I have strived to embody. And it is a model of ministry that Kathy Gustafson has lived out each and every day she has served First Christian Church of Stow, Ohio. Kathy has been present to all of us. No matter how near or how far away Kathy was from us, or we from her, she was always present- for us. Whether it was through a word of love and support when she came through the line after church, whether it was in a card that said Happy Birthday, Happy Anniversary, Get Well Soon, or Deepest Sympathy, or whether it was through a thoughtful conversation in the church office. Kathy Gustafson was present. She was always present to let us know someone was thinking about us, someone was praving for us, someone was making sure we knew we are loved and we are not alone.

During her time at First Christian Church of Stow, Kathy Gustafson has been the quintessential Minister of Presence.

I will never forget when I came to First Christian Church of Stow. After serving as an Associate Pastor for six and half years, I had just put on my big boy preacher pants and was set to find my way as a Senior Pastor. I quickly learned that three years of seminary, years of field placement, and years with an incredible church and amazing mentor had equipped me greatly, I still didn't know everything about being a Senior Pastor. And soon I couldn't help but wonder if I was in over my head.

Fortunately for me, Kathy was there, fully present, ready to show me the ropes of First Christian Stow; introduce me to members; slyly remind me of names; bring me up to speed on historic events; and most importantly, keep me from messing up too badly. Kathy, from my first day, set me up for, and put me on a path towards, a successful pastorate. She was kind, considerate, helpful, compassionate, and oh so patient with me. And she was this way not because I was new and possibly in over my head, but because that is who she is. And I was blessed because of it.

Kathy has always been present in ways that is rarely seen anymore. Through the gifts she blessed me with, and through the gifts she has blessed others with, Kathy has been more than our church's Administrative Assistant. She has been a Minister of Presence. And it is a model of ministry we all can, and should, strive to emulate and continue to make real in our world. This rarely seen way is needed because people need more than just being told they are loved and not alone. People need to be shown, reminded often, and assured through the presence of others in their life that they are loved and that they are not alone.

So just as we have been shown by Christ Jesus; and as we have been shown through the good and faithful career of God's servant to First Christian Church of Stow, may we all strive to be ministers of presence.

#### Update from the Stewardship Team Financial Giving from the Congregation for January – March 2021

We won't close the financial books for March for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving.

The Congregational Giving budget amount is \$20,741 per month. This includes loose offerings and Week of Compassion donations.

For the month of March (through 03/28) we have received \$20,581. For the month this is slightly below the budget amount by \$160. Year to date we have received \$62,224. This is below the budget amount Year to date by \$1,757.

As we shared in December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2021 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2021 Leap of Faith amount is \$20,046 for the year.

## Search Team Update

As we prepare to say goodbye to our administrative assistant, a search team has been working hard for the past couple of months to find her replacement. This team consists of Elders, Financial staff, Christian Education staff, Technical crew members, and the Pastor. Meeting weekly for some time, this team has identified and discussed at length the ever changing landscape in church dynamics, functions, and needs when it comes to being a twentyfirst century church. And in doing so the team identified several key areas of need for our church, all while discerning the direction God is calling us to take with our next hire.

The bottom line is that the position will look and function in many similar manners to how the position has been historically; however there are new aspects as well. Therefore to adjust to these changes, while incorporating the needed current aspects, the search team felt now was the time to revamp and revision the position—starting with a new job title and job description.

Below is the job posting that has been put out into the universe. We have received several applicants, but due to the March calendar and Holy Week, interviews are not being scheduled until after Easter. Which means there is still time for you to share this ministry opportunity with someone who you think might fit the job description below.

We are excited for the new direction and new ministry opportunity God is revealing to us here at First Christian Church. May we all be in prayer for this ongoing search process.

#### Position Description: Director of Church Relations Summary

The First Christian Church of Stow has an open position for a part time church Director of Church Relations.

The successful candidate will be the heart of our church operations and the bridge of communication to the many generations of our church family, guests and community members. We are looking for an applicant who has strong organizational skills and the ability to think creatively and critically in order to develop systems that facilitate communication that lead to deeper relationships and broader community connections.

The position will require a maximum of 25 hours/week, 5 hours of which are on Sunday morning to coordinate and manage the live streaming of worship.

#### Responsibilities

• Work closely with the Senior Pastor in partnership to facilitate effective communications and

relations with church members, guests, and the broader community.

- Manage the operations of the church, including: answering phones, scheduling meetings and church spaces, setting up Zoom calls, and putting together weekly worship bulletins and a monthly newsletter.
- Coordinate and facilitate the technology for Sunday morning live-streaming of the worship service.
- Execute updates to the church website and post social media content
- Draft and execute communication to Governing Board, Elders, Trustees, committees, members of the church, guests, and broader community involvement
