July 2021 Pastor's Pen

It was a day that was delayed again and again.

It was a day that had its challenges to make happen.

It was a day that had a lot of moving parts, and not to mention busy and full calendars to coordinate.

It was a day that needed a lot of people to work together and make happen all the moving parts.

It was a day that had roadblock after roadblock spring up in its way.

But it was an amazing day that was never, ever, *cancelled*.

This truth, that it was an amazing day that could never be cancelled, was a message I shared with the community who gathered at Silver Lake Beach for the baptisms of the ten students who had completed our church's Pastor's Class. This day amazing day of confessions of faith, of baptisms, of first communions, of celebration, of love, of becoming a new creation in the body of Christ was never cancelled because God's grace and forgiveness, God's hope, peace, joy, and love can never, ever, be cancelled.

And though it was delayed, and postponed, and filled with challenges, what an incredible, amazing, and faithful day it was. Baptisms at 9 a.m. at Silver Lake—thanks to church members and Silver Lake Trustees who were incredibly helpful, gracious, considerate, generous, and kind. Worship at 10 a.m. that celebrated the gift and blessings of baptism through scripture, word, song, prayer, reminders of our baptisms and our responsibility to the newly baptized, and even video footage of each baptism that was quickly yet professionally cut, edited, and inserted into the service for all to see. And then a serene and sacred service of first communion for the newly baptized, and communion for all who gathered, at a make-shift outdoor chapel upon our church grounds—complete with music, more than sufficient sound and song, prayer, table, bread, and cup. All concluded with a wonderful time of food and fellowship bathed in the beauty and gentle breeze of an absolutely gorgeous June summer day.

It was an amazing day that was delayed, again and again, but it was never cancelled.

Baptism Sunday 2021 for the ten students who were baptized, for their families, for our church family, and for the body of Christ was a physically manifestation of the Apostle Paul's who said, "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

And not only was Baptism Sunday 2021 an embodiment of Romans 8:38-39, but now, because of all that had to happen for it to happen, we can faithfully add to the Apostle Paul's list: nor pandemic, nor social distancing, nor quarantining, nor having to gather online, nor having to keep to our pods, nor having to delay events, nor having to work out logistics and busy schedules, nor any amount of roadblocks—real or metaphorical—will ever be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

It was a day that was long in coming. But it came nevertheless because God's love cannot be stopped—by anything or anyone. And what an amazing day it was. It has been a long time since my heart was as filled as it was on Baptism Sunday 2021.

So may we remember our baptisms, and the love and grace and forgiveness we have been given over and over again since that day. May we remember the ten students and what they did on their baptism Sunday, and hold them in our prayers as they begin the next stage of their faith journey. May we remember our responsibility to them, and to all of God's children, to be those who live as those who are part of the body of Christ by sharing the Good news of Jesus with all people. And may we give thanks for, and embrace the truth, that no matter what, nothing can ever cancel God's grace and forgiveness, God's hope, peace, joy, and love.

What an amazing day it was because of God's love. And what amazing days are to come, because of God's love.

Bulldog Bags Update May – June 20201

Though the pandemic changed how Bulldog Bags had to operate through 2020, an incredible service to the Stow-Munroe Falls community has been accomplished. Below are just a few of the details from their charity.

- 11,112 Bulldog Bags packed and distributed
- \$44,486.19 was spent on the 18 packings (\$2,471.46 average per packing)
- Due to the safety guidelines, food was set-up and bags were packed by about 12 dedicated volunteers.
- Other dedicated volunteers delivered an average of 51 bins to the schools for each packing (924 bins total for the 18 packings)!

As we celebrate the good works in the year prior, we prepare for the service ahead (and believe it or not, there's more to do than ever before!). The summer *Bulldog Boxes* program has more registered families than ever before! With 107 families to serve, First Christian Church of Stow has a chance to serve our community through Bulldog Boxes and it's associated events. Upcoming is their Stow Picnic on July 26th. John Lewis Bridge Dedication Saturday, July 17, 9 a.m.

In September 2020, Stow City Council passed a resolution to rename the Steels Corners Bridge after Congressman John Lewis. The bridge naming resolution follows the unanimously passed resolution to Promote Racial Equality in Stow, cosponsored by Councilwomen Sindi Harrison and Christina Shaw in June 2020.

On July 17, 2021, The City of Stow will commemorate the naming of The John Lewis Memorial Bridge with a march across the bridge and dedication ceremony. The march will begin at 9:00 a.m. from the T.G.I.Friday's parking lot, move across the bridge and end at the Stow Municipal Court for the dedication. The dedication program will begin at Stow Municipal Court at 9:45 AM.

"John Lewis was a tremendous man, and this dedication of The John Lewis Memorial Bridge is one way we can honor his legacy as a staunch supporter of equality and The City of Stow's commitment to support diversity." said City of Stow Mayor John Pribonic.

The bridge dedication is one of three events currently being promoted by the City of Stow Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Initiative. The City of Stow has also renamed what was once The Silver Springs Lodge, *The Leona Farris Lodge* in honor of former Stow resident Leona Farris which will be dedicated September 16, 2021. The new Summa Health Stow-Kent Medical Center opened June 26, 2021 and also pays homage to the first Black residents of Stow, including Leona Farris, whose homes once stood on the site.

<u>Update from the</u> <u>Finance/Stewardship Team</u> Financial Giving from the Congregation for January – June 2021

We won't close the financial books for June for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving.

The Total Income budget amount is \$21,181 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental. For the month of June, so far, our income is \$21,080. For the month this is below the budget amount by \$101.

Year to date our income has been \$131,059. This is above the budget for Year to date by \$3,972.

You can see that our income dropped in June, compared to May. If our giving can return to a level exceeding the budget that will help us successfully meet our 'Leap of Faith', where our budgeted expenses are higher than our budgeted income!

As we shared in December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2021 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2021 Leap of Faith amount is \$20,046 for the full year. If you personally are feeling financially stable and would like to make an additional gift to the church above your normal giving, those are always appreciated. Any increases will help position us to be able to increase the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both local and globally.
