Pastor's Pen, September 2021

The Elders and Worship Team are excited to announce the return to a "new" normal...



Hopefully by now you have seen this headline and

read the rest of its message too—that on Sunday, September 12th First Christian Church will return to two worship services, 8:30 in the Chapel and <u>10:30</u> in the Sanctuary, with opportunities for Christian Education and/or choir warm-ups in between. And it's probably no surprise that I wrote the headline that put to use the term we all have been hearing and saying over the last number of months—"a <u>NEW</u> normal." We know what it means, but really, what does it mean?

Often when something new happens, particularly in the church, we aren't exceedingly happy our excited about it. (Not this church though, right!?!?) The word "new" to a lot of church folk is just a fancy way of saying "Things are about to change." And the idea of change in the church has been the downfall of many a preacher.

I have a clergy colleague who told me how on the night before his very first Sunday at a church he decided to rearrange the seating set-up in the sanctuary. He thought the new arrangement would be better for folks to see one another and...well... no matter his reasoning he quickly learned just how bad an idea it was. Introducing a "new" normal on your first Sunday? Might want to rethink that idea and remember that a "new" pastor is enough "newness" for one Sunday.

Change is hard. We all know this. But change is necessary. And we all know this too. And changes are coming to First Christian Church because such changes are necessary for the success of our ministries. The Elders, the Christian Education Team, the Music Department, and the Worship Team all met and talked and prayerfully discerned the changes and it all became abundantly clear now was the time to make these new things happen, and set in motion this "new normal."

What is really interesting, and what we all need to consider, is that doing a *new* thing, isn't all that *new* of a thing. New things have been happening, literally, forever. Literally. Each day is new, and no matter what you do, it won't be like the day before. Yes, that's an easy example, but still worth

noting. So let's look at our faith and God's word for how newness has factored in.

The prophet Isaiah spoke of God "doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah was telling God's people who were in a tough place that God was at work, and God's work is going to be new and good.

The Apostle Paul said, "Jesus has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, so that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace." Paul was helping people become a church, and that God's work in Jesus was new and good.

And the writer of the book of Revelation said, "And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.'" And, well, this is all about new and eternal life, which is certainly good.

These are just a few of the references of the times God was at work to make things new, to make them better for the people who would be impacted. And another time is now, here at First Christian Church of Stow. We are coming back to a normal Sunday morning schedule, but with second service at a new time—10:30 a.m. Our order of worship is new, although only slightly. We are aiming to get the choir back sharing their gifts and talents, but with covid numbers where they are we are going to have to do that in a new way for the time being. We have new staffers—welcome again Christian and Katie!—and they are beginning new ministries that are bringing about new possibilities, some you won't notice, others you probably will. And we will be continuing to offer this new way of being part of worship via livestream, which means there will be a new impact upon what church looks like and feels like on Sunday morning. Some of it will be hard. But I am one hundred percent confident it will be absolutely faithful.

So if in the coming Sundays the new normal is feeling hard for you, please let me know. Please come talk to me. I want to hear from you and I want to share with you more about why this new thing is happening. And then, please also remember God is always at work and always doing a new thing. And God's work—no matter what it is—is always good. Especially when it's new.

DCEF Tech Grant: September Update

As many of you already know (and have contributed towards!) We are in the midst of raising funds for the DCEF tech grant, which is described further below. In just a month of fundraising, we're already at \$1,947! This is a great start, but we still have a long way to go. See below for more information about the grant.

To take advantage of this grant, however, we need to raise enough of our own funds for DCEF to "match" our own fundraising. DCEF is willing to provide up to \$4,171 towards our purchase of tech equipment. The amount they provide is dependent on the amount we raise through contributions first. For example:

- **If we raise \$3,000** then DCEF will provide an additional \$3,000.
- **If we raise \$4,000** then DCEF will provide an additional \$4,000.
- **If we raise \$5,000** then DCEF will provide an additional \$4,171.

If you feel called to contribute to the online life of our church beyond your initial offerings, please note that part of your contribution as "Tech Grant" and our financial team will include it as part of this effort.

STEWARDSHIP CHALLENGE

An elderly Chinese woman had two large pots, each hung on the ends of a pole which she carried across her neck. One of the pots had a crack in it while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water. At the end of the long walks from the stream to the house, the cracked pot arrived only half full. For a full two years this went on, with the woman bringing home only one and a half pots of water. Of course, the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments. But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection, and miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do. After two years of what it perceived to be bitter failure, it spoke to the woman one day by the stream. "I am ashamed of myself, because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your house." The old woman smiled, "Did you notice that there are flowers on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I have always known about your flaw, so I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we walk back, you water them. For two years I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate the table. Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace the house."

God created us, and as such, he knows our strengths and weaknesses, our gifts and our imperfections, our motivations, and stumbling blocks. And with knowing all of that, God knows what our best purpose is. So don't be ashamed by what you think you can't do but embrace the things that you can. In doing so, you will get to see all the things God has been able to use you for. And as you see what God has been using you for and what good you have been able to do, think about what could be next. What else does God have in store for you? What else is God asking of you? What else are you capable of and what else can you give? 

- The Elders continue to encourage our Covid responses:

- There will be teachers and lessons available for youth Sunday School.
- Adult Sunday will be held in abeyance for the time being. We are working on a new program that will be ready later in the fall.

<u>Financial Giving from the Congregation</u> <u>for January – August 2021</u>

We won't close the financial books for August for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a good estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income budget amount is \$21,181 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental. For the month of August, so far, our income is \$25,714. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$4,533.

Year to date our income has been \$177,936. This is above the budget for Year to date by \$8,486 (5%).

This is very good news and brings us much closer to meeting our Leap of Faith amount!

Some of the increase in August income is from building rental, with increased use over the summer months by some outside groups. But the bulk of the increase has come from increased giving from our members.

As we shared in December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2021 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2021 Leap of Faith amount is \$20,046 for the full year, which is 8% above our budget income.

Any increases will help position us to be able to increase the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both local and globally.
