#### Pastor's Pen, November 2021

Things are about to get hairy here at First Christian Church! And no, I am not talking about the upcoming 2021 budget proposal. (Although you might be



onto something if that's what you were thinking. So come on folks! Get those *estimate of giving cards* in please!) But things are about to get hairy around the church for another reason—*No Shave November!*—a month-long journey during which participants forgo shaving and grooming in order to evoke conversation and raise cancer awareness.

*No-Shave November* has been a tradition for years as November marks the beginning of the cold weather months. But in 2009 the eight children of Matthew Hill decided to reinvent the activity to raise awareness and money for charity after their father passed away from colon cancer in November 2007.

Participants of *No-Shave November* had always been willing to ditch their razors, so for more than ten years this family has been encouraging participants to go a step further with their noshaving efforts by donating the savings from not shaving for a month to cancer fighting foundations. Since starting this challenge "*No-Shavers*", as we are called, have donated the cost of grooming (from a few dollars on razors to \$100 on a salon visit) and helped the Matthew Hill Foundation raise over \$10 million dollars for their cancer fighting efforts. From a few Facebook followers willing to donate their hard-earned money, to thousands of donors championing against cancer, *No-Shave November* has become a nationwide celebration.

The rules of No-Shave November are simple: put down your razor for 30 days and donate your monthly hair-maintenance expenses to the cause. If there is a strict dress-code at work that's ok— the foundation encourages participation of any kind; so grooming and trimming are perfectly acceptable.

The overall goal of *No-Shave November* is to grow awareness by embracing the hairiness, which many cancer patients lose. Yes, that might sound a bit counterintuitive—grow hair in awareness to those who lose their hair? Sure, why not? Especially if it gets people talking and supporting a worthy cause. And remember; the Hill family was using a pre-existing practice and taking it to a new level to create awareness and support. So by letting

hair grow wild and free, it *frees* up money to be donated, AND it gets people talking about *wild* and *hairy* issues, like for instance, "Why is the pastor looking so scruffy?" Which can be responded to by saying, "Oh, that's because he's participating in 'No-Shave November' which seeks to create a broader awareness to cancer prevention, help save lives, and aid those fighting the battle of cancer."

In July of 2017 I lost my Dad, Al Rumburg, to colon cancer. But my Dad wasn't the only person in my life affected and impacted by cancer. There are others. Too many others. And I know each of you have a loved one who has been impacted by cancer. And I know many of you yourselves have fought, or continue to fight, a battle with cancer. And so this is just one small way I am acknowledging, remembering, and honoring those who I know and love who have been impacted by this awful disease.

I have a "no-shave" page and a nominal goal, so if you are interested in it let me know. But that's not why I write this. I write this so that we all might, in this month of November when we will celebrate Thanksgiving, add another item to our long lists of items we are thankful for.

I am thankful for my Dad who, though has been gone for more than four years, still guides me and inspires me to do the best I can. I am thankful for those I love who survive and that I still have them in my life. I am thankful for the blessed time I had with those who didn't survive. I am thankful for those who refuse to give up on what seems like a futile effort to find a cure. I am thankful for each of you who sees my hairiness and understands me well enough to know that there is a faithful reason behind the effort. I am thankful for those who know that to do even the tiniest something is infinitely more than doing nothing.

November is a time to reap and gather; a time to remember and give thanks; a time to celebrate all that is good around us—most especially the abundance that comes from God. And November is a time, for me at least, to embrace the *hairiness* of life. So if things get a bit too hairy for you, or if they are too un-kept for what you think a pastor ought to look, I hope you will take a second to remind yourself that in the hairiness of life, there is love to be found. May we all find it. And may we all do whatever we can to help others find it too. Happy Thanksgiving.

A Congregational Conclave— "an assembly that is designed to have special authority and influence." And assembly we have! Thank you to everyone who has come to be part of this ongoing Congregational Conclave. Now that we have done this first session, where we have looked at the strengths and weaknesses of our church, we are set to take the next step in this discernment process that will lead us from intent to impact.

These conclaves are our chance to assess the state of our church, the community and culture around us, while also providing each of us the opportunity to give voice and discernment as to how

we feel God is calling and directing First Christian Church of Stow, Ohio to faithfully move forward.

To provide ample opportunity for all to participate, we will conduct this second session of the Congregational Conclave in that same manner as the first—spanning 5 weeks. We ask you to attend at least one 45 minute session. (You are welcome to attend more though!) Sessions will be held in-person on Sunday mornings, and then there will be one session held via zoom on a Wednesday evening.

Self-assessment in a community is not easy, but we ask that you take time before attending to consider the lifestyle of our church, what we celebrate about it, and what might need to change, and then come with an open mind and heart and share your thoughts and hear the thoughts of others. We hope you'll join us as we begin to discern what kind of church we are being called to be next year, in five years, and beyond.

### <u>Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team</u> Financial Giving from the Congregation for January – October 2021

We won't close the financial books for October for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a close estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income budget amount is \$21,181 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

For the month of October, so far, our income is \$24,963. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$3.782.

Year to date our income has been \$224,777. This is above the budget for Year to date by \$12,963 (6.1%).

#### This is very good news and brings us much closer to meeting our Leap of Faith amount!

As we saw in August, there has been some increased use of the building rental, but the bulk of this increase for October has come from congregational giving.

As we shared last December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2021 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2021 Leap of Faith amount is \$20,046 for the full year, which is 8% above our budget income.

if you personally are feeling financially stable and would like to make an additional gift to the church above your normal giving, those are always appreciated. Any increases will help position us to be able to increase the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both local and globally.
