Pastor's Pen, December 2021

It's December, and that means... Christmas! I love Christmas. Sure, it's cliché to say because who doesn't love Christmas? Well, actually, I believe there are some, but in



general December, Advent, Christmas, New Years, the Holidays—they really are *the most wonderful* time of the year! (Not to be confused with *the best* time of the year—summer! Two separate seasons, both with their wonder, whimsy and good times. Paradoxical, I know. But I digress.)

If you heard/read my sermon from the first Sunday of Advent then you heard/read my admission of listening to Christmas music since the first week of November. (Again, really, it just happened. And I swear I was thinking of Thanksgiving the whole time!) And I've been listening because it has made me feel cheery. joyful, and peaceful. And who couldn't use a few more moments of cheeriness, joyfulness, and peacefulness? I can't think of anyone—not even those who don't love the holiday season! (Because let us remember, chances are the reason some don't love the holiday season is because either they are without a loved one and their absence makes the season exceedingly difficult; or perhaps their past experiences within the season left them scarred from a trauma that still lingers strong. Among other reasons too, of course.) So no matter the circumstances, I won't believe for a second there is anyone who would say, "You're offering more cheeriness, joyfulness, and peacefulness? Nah, I'm good." There is just too much that robs us of such feelings, and when opportunities to find again those feelings and moments—we should take them.

And yes, for those who have been paying attention over the years, this is a shift in beliefs and practices for me. Before I would get annoyed with the playing of Christmas music and the putting up of Christmas trees and decorations three weeks before Thanksgiving. But I'm over that school of thought. Call me a flip-flopper if you want. Accuse me of saying one thing one time, and something different another time. It's fine. I suppose it's accurate. But the deeper truth is...times have changed... circumstances have changed... the world has changed...I have changed. And with changes comes the changing of needs. Before, I could wait until at least the day after Thanksgiving for the Christmas season to start. But now I'm cranking up to "11" all my favorite versions of Oh Holy Night and The First Noel. (Incidentally, look up on YouTube Gene Simmons and Paul Stanley of the famous rock band Kiss perform *The* First Noel...on the triangle! Its whimsy meets mind blowing ironic joy! You can thank me later.) And I let myself make this change because I needed, just like

many of us need, more cheeriness, joyfulness, and peacefulness today.

But I don't stop with music, mind you. I turn also to familiar passages of scripture that remind me of the message, truth, power, hope, peace, joy, and love that Christmas brings. Scripture readings like... Isaiah 43:18-19, where the prophet says, "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." I tell you what...that's what I'm talkin' about! "Forget about the former things. I'm doing a new thing," says God. "Can you not see that? And I am inviting you to be a part of it?" (Paraphrased, of course.) Isaiah is speaking of the coming Messiah who would come and do a *new thing*. And Jesus fulfilled that prophecy in showing us that new thing, a new way of living and being and moving in life.

And always that new way will stretch us. Over and over again in the Gospels, the message Jesus has for those who would emulate him in the world is, in essence, "I want to show you something new. Whatever standard you once used for how to live and treat people and find meaning, I'm asking you to do something different." Which is hard—it *stretches* us. But the reason Jesus calls us to stretch and do something different is because times have changed, circumstances have changed, the world has changed, and we have changed. The needs of those around us, and those who we cross paths with, they are going through times of change too—and most of those changes are really, really hard. This is true today, just as it has been true always. So God sends the message, through the prophet Isaiah, and then later in Jesus, for us to emulate and learn that we need to at times forget the "way we've always done it", and perceive the new "it" God is doing around us. But here's the amazing part we dare not forget. Whatever new thing God is doing, it's going to be so amazing, so incredible, so life giving it will be like a way in the wilderness (when we are lost) and waters flowing in the desert.

So as we walk deeper into this "most wonderful time of the year" let us consider what new thing God is calling us to. Let us be mindful of those who find this time of year not so wonderful, and consider how we can share with them the Good News of the new thing God is surely doing for them, and help them perceive it. For when we become part of the new thing God is going—during the holiday season and all throughout the year—then we will always find not just whimsy and cheeriness, but we will be enveloped by God's hope, peace, joy, and love. And who couldn't use a bit more of that? Merry Christmas everyone.

Clergy Renewal 2022

STEWARDSHIP CHALLENGE

The gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke each tell the story of the rich man and Jesus. We're all familiar with it.

A faithful wealthy man asks what he needs to do to earn eternal life; Jesus tells him to keep the commandments.

The man says "yes, yes, I've done all this, what else should I do?".

And Jesus comes right back with: "Go sell all of your earthly possessions, give everything to the poor, and follow me".

The rich man goes away sad because he knows he just can't do it. And that's pretty relatable, isn't it? I don't know about you but I kind of like my stuff.

But of course, Jesus was giving a lesson that wasn't really intended for the rich man. He's giving a lesson to his disciples and through them to us. Jesus's lesson—it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than it is for a rich man to enter heaven—is that we can't earn or buy our way into eternal life. That is a gift given by God. "With men this is impossible." Jesus tells the disciples. "But with God all things are possible."

So why do we make our offerings and tithes? It's obviously not a quid pro quo arrangement.

We do it for many reasons. To support the ministries which are important to us and our community. To focus our mind by giving back a portion of what we receive. And, ultimately, we do it as an expression of love for God.

That was quite a way to kick off the giving season. On Sunday November 20th our church served food to over 35 separate families. All told, over 108 people received a full meal and four bags of groceries.

This is 108 people who will have food to eat during Thanksgiving week because of prayers, financial support, and hard work from the members of First Christian Church.

This is the highest number of families and people that we have served at Loaves & Fishes + Pantry. The people who received food were all thankful that we have this ministry. Their gratitude is heartfelt and special and makes the effort worthwhile.

And a very special thanks to all our volunteers, those who bought the food, cooked the food, bagged the food, served the food, and loaded the food into cars. It's a team effort and each person who helped is vital to the success of this ministry.

Miracles? Magic? And Beans?

It takes a village. It takes a Church! Miracles and magic! Drive thru meal blessings!

We served 108 meals this Sunday, from seven donated turkeys and every last spoonful of mashed potatoes, stuffing, and green beans. At one point, we ran out of beans! We started looking around the kitchen for any green beans we had left, and we found just two cans of beans. They served our very last guests this Sunday. Thanks to God for saving two cans for them!

An Opportunity for Outreach!

It is amazing to think that Christmas is weeks away! This time of year is so wonderful for friends, family, and the Christmas spirit, but I feel the time between Thanksgiving and Christmas is a special time to acknowledge the true meaning of the season, remember our blessings, and give to others.

I want to take this platform to share an outreach opportunity I have enjoyed for years and invite my church family to participate! I read a book many years ago, and the author explained how his father would take him as a child to nursing homes to visit complete strangers. These visits turned into opportunities for the father and son to listen to the residents, especially the ones who had no visitors. Everyone has a story to share, and I realized after reading this book that I could do something special for strangers who have no visitors.

I think many people can relate when I confess that I would buy Christmas cards, not use all of them, and convince myself that I would use the remaining cards next year. Of course, I would buy new cards and the previous ones are forgotten. I decided to repurpose my abandoned cards, collect "we'll use them next year" cards from others, and give them to people who would appreciate them. Every year I write messages in the extra cards and drop them off to local nursing homes with the instructions to distribute them to residents, especially the ones who have no visitors.

I would love to extend an invitation to join this tradition that I love to do each year! There will be a card donation tote in the front lobby for "We'll Use Them Next Year" Cards. There are a few ways to become involved!

- If you have any boxes of unused cards (even if it is a few), please consider donating them and dropping them off in the donation tote. I will fill them out with a message and deliver them to a local nursing home.
- Feel free to fill out your donated cards with messages for the residents! Wish them a blessed Christmas season to remind them they are thought of and prayed for.
- Don't have cards to give this year? That's okay, you can still be involved! Like Easter and Halloween candy, the best time to buy

Christmas cards is after Christmas! Stock up on 75% off boxes of cards and donate them to the tote for next year.

Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team

<u>Financial Giving from the Congregation for January – November 2021</u>

We won't close the financial books for November for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a close estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income budget amount is \$21,181 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

For the month of November, so far, our income is \$26,715. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$5,534.

Year to date our income has been \$251,841. This is above the budget for Year to date by \$18,846 (8.1%).

This is very good news, and as long as our giving continues on this path for December, we will hit our Leap of Faith amount!!

We are so very grateful and blessed that our congregation is willing to share these good gifts, and we look forward to how we collectively can use them to share God's love to our local and global community!

As we shared last December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2021 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2021 Leap of Faith amount is \$20,046 for the full year, which is 8% above our budget income.

Any increases will help position us to be able to increase the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both local and globally.
