2021 Report for Loaves & Fishes + Pantry

2021 was a big year for our Loaves & Fishes + Pantry.

Our pantry provided groceries for 236 households consisting of 601 individuals. This included 292 children and 309 seniors.

All told we gave out enough groceries to provide 3,306 meals.

But wait, there's more... Our Loaves & Fishes crew prepared and served hot meals for all those households.

That's right, over 3,300 hot meals were served to our neighbors.

But wait, there's more... During the Ingathering Distribution, we provided groceries to cover 888 meals for the families we served.

In 2022 we look forward to continued growth with the Loaves & Fishes + Pantry program.

Our food costs will rise, but this increase will be partially offset by a grant from the Summit County Department of Jobs and Family Services. The money from this grant will be used by the Food Bank to offset the cost of food items in the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program.

<u>Family Promise</u> <u>Promises Fulfilled</u>

God's work in our community is being more fully realized as different programs are responding to participants with reviews of their successes and blessings. From Family Promise, a great report of 2021 comes through. Over 80% of the families that Family Promise served this year have left into permanent housing! They had only expected to see 60% of families housed, but through blessings this year, they have had the opportunity to see another 1/5th of their families being housed. Additionally, they have 26 children in their program, and each received at least 6 gifts this Christmas, giving them some joy despite all circumstances.

Thank you for all of your gifts towards the church and these programs within the community. Ushering families in need toward permanent housing can give them great peace of mind and a much higher quality of life in comparison to circumstances that they've come from. These families will be a little warmer this winter.

2022 BUDGET APPROVED

Hello First Christian Family!

We just wanted to make sure you heard the good news. We have unanimously approved our church budget for 2022. We are truly blessed by the fact that you have remained "Devoted to Generosity," the theme of this year's campaign. Because of your devotion to the mission and ministry of THIS CHURCH, we have been able to stay open and active during these very trying times, to continue the ministries that are so important to so many, and to provide a place for organizations that rely on our church to meet and serve those in need. Your devotion to this church is really your faithfulness and commitment to God through which we can emulate his Peace, Love and Joy, and receive His final promise of Everlasting Life.

The blessings received from 2021 has allowed us to make our Leap of Faith, and gives us the confidence that not only allows us to maintain our current status, but to flourish and further our growth and commitment within the community, region, for you, the people of Stow First Christian, and most important our God. A few of the approval hi-lights, include:

- A well deserved 5% pay increase for our Church Staff, the first since 2019.
- Although we can never replace someone like Kathy Gustafson, we have been able to fill our church secretarial duties with Christian Sanko, in a newly created position "Director of Church Relations". Christian's skillset will not only allow us to fill Kathy's administrative duties, but also allows a look at advancing our technologies. One such item would be our Facebook Live Worship Service, which we will continue with as part of our normal operating procedure into the future.
- We have added a position "Director of Youth Ministries", filled by our own life-time church member, Katie Taylor to better serve our youth and its programs.
- We have added money to upgrade our worship and other technologies for better audio and video capabilities, and also ways to upgrade the processing of the service.
- We have increased our financial support for the monthly food outreach Plus Pantry, which is held monthly along with the Loaves and Fishes meal. With these additional funds we can continue to provide grocery items along with the meal, to better serve the needs of our local community.

We know in times like these, personal financial decisions can be difficult, and we thank you so much for your thoughtfulness and faithfulness in support of our work here on earth. Because of that, we can continue to share God's love and blessings with our local and global communities.

Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team

<u>Financial Giving from the Congregation for January – December 2021</u>

We won't close the financial books for 2021 for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a close estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income budget amount is \$21,181 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

For the month of December, so far, our income is \$24,811. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$3,667.

Year to date our income has been \$276,653. This is above the budget for Year to date by \$22,477 (8.8%).

This is very good news!! This means that we have made our Leap of Faith amount!!

We are so very grateful and blessed that our congregation is willing to share these good gifts, and we look forward to how we collectively can use them to share God's love to our local and global community!
