Pastor's Pen, February 2022

As I sit in my home office and look out the window, a winter wonderland continues to amass. And



amass. And amass. It's a snow-day today. A snow-day that was actually announced last night, and the excitement of that announcement in this house was palpable, for a snow-day is something rare and special. But now the snow-day is about to begin, because soon the kiddos will awake to their snow-day, and the joy of the day will no doubt be robust. This quiet time before they are up is a bit of a calm before the proverbial storm.

I'm starting to think that January was kind of the same for me—a calm before the storm. But less a calm before "a storm" and more of a calm before "a whirlwind!" You see, I say this because it is absolutely 100% certain that I will be taking my much talked about, and twice postponed sabbatical. It's happening. Pandemic, or no pandemic; storm, or no storm; flood, or no flood; plagues of frogs, gnats, or flies* or not, this sabbatical is going to happen. (*See Exodus 8 for more information.) But there is a multitude of matters to tend to before it all happens. Yes, a laundry list of matters I need to get in order, but there's a bit of list for each of you as well. But don't worry... as I often say, "many hands make light work." (A quote I by no means claim as my own, but just use a lot.)

So what are the things that we all need to do to get ready? I am glad you asked!

First...pray. I invite you to hold this coming time of sabbatical in your prayers, asking for God's guidance to surround us all as we prepare for this time in all the ways needed. Pray God leads us to open our hearts to the importance and significance of this time of renewal that is meant to be one part of the ongoing preparations for where God will be taking First Christian Church of Stow in the coming years.

Second...discern. I invite you to enter into a time of discernment, starting now and throughout the coming months, to listen for God's still small voice to tell you and direct you to where and how you can continue to, or offer in new ways, your gifts and talents. Each of us are members of one body, but there are many parts. What part is God calling us to be in the coming months and years? How is God leading us to use our gifts and talents in service to the Church and others?

Third...believe. I invite you to believe this time of sabbatical—a time of renewal for me and for you—is a gift and a blessing God is giving to us so we can be better prepared for where God is taking us and for what God is going to ask us to do.

And lastly...commit. I invite you to commit to this time of sabbatical, this time of renewal. I invite you to commit to supporting me and my family prayerfully during our time away. I invite you to commit to supporting the church, the staff, the elders, and the interim pastor during our time away. I invite you to commit to continue to be the church, and be part of the life of First Christian Church, in the months ahead—and to not see this as a time to "take a break because the pastor is gone." I say that not as a condemnation, because I know your commitment to the Church and our church is true and faithful. Rather I say that as an encouragement because we all know how easy it can be to convince ourselves that it's fine to "take a little break." And yes, it is fine to take a break, to breathe, to rest. But there is a difference between taking a break and breaking away. My sabbatical time, this opportunity for renewal, this chance to step away from the day-to-day practices of ministry in order to focus on my spiritual development with an eye toward returning to all of you with renewed energy for the ministry we will then do together, won't be effective whatsoever if I am left wondering and worrying if there will be a church left to come back to.

Pray. Discern. Believe. Commit. This is the list of things to do before and during the upcoming time of sabbatical. Yes, each piece breaks down into longer lists of things to do, but these are the first and foremost matters we all need to focus on tending to. For when we do, we are letting God prepare us and lead us in a unique and special time in the life of First Christian Church, where God will reveal to all of us the blessed, hope-filled, exciting future and successful future ministry God is planning to do in and through us as individuals and us as a church.

I am excited for this sabbatical. Almost as excited as a fourth grader and a second grader when a snow-day is announced. (I don't think that level of excitement can ever be matched by an adult. Seriously, snow days are strangely magical for kids.) And I hope and pray you are excited too because this sabbatical, this time of renewal, the before, during, and after, will be a blessing to us all.

The world has changed dramatically in the last 2 years. In the past year alone, we have witnessed this in places like Myanmar, Afghanistan, and elsewhere in the Middle East.

The September Loaves & Fishes + Pantry took place on Sunday January 16 and was quite a success. We served 22 households comprising 46 people. 29 of those we served were seniors.

A program such is ours is always important, but it is even more important when bad weather comes. You may recall that Sunday the 16th was the beginning our big snow. So that's 29 seniors who not only got a hot chili dinner but also received enough groceries to see them through the storm and its aftermath. We didn't get an exact count of the number of chili dinners served, but it was more than 46 people who received groceries.

Let's have a big shout out to the Girl Scouts who helped deliver the meals. The seniors we serve always get a charge out of seeing young people in action.

This monthly outreach of Loaves & Fishes + Pantry is a living testament of the power and good of our Christian faith. Thank you to all the volunteers who demonstrate their faith through their actions.

The Memorial Team had an active year in 2021. We received memorial gifts totaling \$2560.00. These were donated in memory of Ellie Wiggins, Dave Brandon, Myra Myers, Larry Williams, Bill Bell and Don Howard.

We contributed \$3,513.10 the upgrade of the lower level playground. We also spent \$20 to add Jack Veatch's name to the Timothy plaque in the Gathering Area.

These are the kind of things that memorial funds are spent on; ways to enhance our church life and our church building and grounds. In the past memorial money helped fund the upgrade to the sanctuary lighting. These funds are **not** used for operating expenses or maintenance costs.

Ingathering 2021 was fantastic, thanks to all of you and our outside sponsors! Through your donations, we provided 41 families with food, food gift cards, gifts for the children, hat/gloves/socks/underwear, coats and fleece blankets. <u>Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team</u> Financial Giving from the Congregation for January, 2022

We won't close the financial books for January for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a close estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income budget amount is \$23,203 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

For the month of January, so far, our income is \$23,859. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$656. This is 2.8% above budget.

It is great to start the year out with our income above budget. This is partially due to a couple folks who contribute their total pledge for 2022 in one payment in January. However, it is still good news! Here is the information in table format:
