<u>Loaves & Fishes + Pantry</u> <u>Summary for 2021</u>

During 2021 our Loaves & Fishes + Pantry served 274 families consisting of 749 individuals. These families consisted of 217 children, 255 adults, and 277 seniors.

In addition to the hot meals prepared by our volunteers, we also gave out 6,727 pounds of food and 738 pounds of produce. This provided roughly 4,494 meals. Between food distributed and hot meals prepared FCC Stow provided about 5,243 to hungry people in our community.

The retail value of the food we distributed was \$8,183. So that's \$8,000 freed up for hungry people to spend on other necessities such as utilities or clothing or additional food.

Needless to say, this was all made possible by our dedicated volunteers and the support of every member of our church. Well Done!

Our May meal distribution was blessed with miracles. Thanks to many we had enough cookies. We found plastic forks upstairs when it appeared we didn't have enough. Take out bags were located when I thought we were out. I defrosted two boxes of chicken when it was supposed to be one. So we baked it all then needed it all.

June's meal is on Father's Day June 19th 4-6 p.m.. We will be having sloppy joes, potato chips and coleslaw. Many of our regular volunteers have family commitments so we need extra help. This sabbatical is being funded by a grant from the Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Programs as administered by the Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis. The use of the term "Clergy Renewal" is intentional as explained in this excerpt from the <u>lillyendowment.org</u> website:

National Clergy Renewal Programs are open to Christian congregations whose pastors serious about parish ministry and who can envision the program as a means of renewing the pastor's commitment to the congregation and ordained ministry. The annual programs are designed for those congregations and pastors who have a strong relationship with one another, a high degree of mutual trust and support, and are eager to see their relationship strengthened, renewed and continued.

The key word is "renewal", which is a two-way street. Not only is this a time for Jonathan to renew his "commitment to the congregation and ordained ministry" but for us renew and strengthen our trust and support for Jonathan and his ministry here at First Christian Church - Stow.

Circle the dates of June 5, July 10, and August 7. Following our service on those Sundays Christian and the Elders will be hosting sessions where where we will investigate ways that we can strengthen and renew our church. There will be a light meal provided by the Membership Team. Each session will run about an hour.

We strongly encourage everyone to attend as many of these sessions as possible. These session are the means by which we support Jonathan in his renewal. He'll be working on his commitment to us, and we'll be working on our commitment to him!
