#### **Loaves & Fishes + Pantry June Update**

On June 19, our Loaves & Fishes served carry out meals for around 65 people. Sloppy Joes plus sides and cookies were enjoyed by all.

The Pantry provided groceries for 25 families with totals of 24 children, 24 adults and 17 seniors. In addition to four bags of groceries each family received a bag of hand soap, hand sanitizer, and disinfecting wipes. The groceries included bread, cereal, trail mix, green beans, carrots, red beans, rice and a box of Entenmanns.

Although our numbers were down a little from May, we served 8 families who were new to our pantry. June 19th was Fathers day,

#### STEWARDSHIP CHALLENGE

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he speaks to them on the idea that the individuals of the church all have different gifts and talents that make them valuable to the growth of the early church. I'm paraphrasing a little, but in Chapter 1 Corinthians, Chapter 12 we read,

<sup>12</sup> There is one body, but it has many parts. But all its many parts make up one body. It is the same with Christ. <sup>13</sup> We were all baptized by one Holy Spirit. And so we are formed into one body. It didn't matter whether we were Jews or Gentiles, slaves or free people. We were all given the same Spirit to drink. <sup>14</sup> So the body is not made up of just one part. It has many parts. In that way, the parts of the body will not take sides. All of them will take care of one another.

<sup>26</sup> If one part suffers, every part suffers with it. If one part is honored, every part shares in its joy. <sup>27</sup> You are the body of Christ. Each one of you is a part of it.

As a people, we are all part of this church. The value we bring, what we have to offer is dependent on who we are. But it's all valuable, it's all worthwhile. And it can all be used for the glory of God. This church does so many great things – through our service, through our outreach, through our programming, through our presence. And that's because of what you do, and give, and provide, as a congregation. So as we take time now to present our gifts, tithes, and offerings, think about what gifts God has given you and what else God may be calling you to do.
