<u>Stocking Tree!</u> <u>Refilling our Pantry for the</u> <u>Community</u>

Please read on to see how you can help the World Outreach Team refill our pantry during the cost of living challenges of inflation, an impending recession, and summer heat.

Good morning and thank you in advance for helping stock our First Christian Church Pantry.

As you leave this morning, you will find a "Tree" with tags hanging from the limbs. Each tag represents "1" item. We understand that MANY people in this church want to help others, that is why we chose to break the donations down into single items. You are welcome to take more than one. What we ask is: PLEASE ONLY BRING WHAT YOU HAVE SELECTED AND ONLY ONE PER TAG. (Weight is an estimate on our part – please use your discretion when purchasing) (canned goods are placed in a dispensing frame). Our Pantry is VERY limited in space. We currently stock 56 items: including a few personal care items. All of this is contained within a 4-foot x 8-foot shelving unit. So, you can see, when we say we have limited space, we mean it.

We will come back to you in the future when we need more items.

There will be a green wagon, or a grey cart for you to put your donated items on. It will be placed by the tree.
