### Pastor's Pen November 2022

It's hard to believe it has been thirteen years since I became your pastor. It seems like just yesterday I pulled into the church parking lot and parked my car in the "Reserved For Pastor" spot. It seems like just yesterday when I held my first staff meeting. It seems like just yesterday when I stood up to preach my first sermon here. Anyone remember that sermon?! I sure do because I was so nervous! I kept thinking, "What if I mess this up!?" Maybe some of you were nervous too, and kept thinking, "What if he messes this up!?" But it's not just how nervous I was that I remember, I remember also what I preached.

The title of the sermon was "The River of Life" and the text was Revelation 22:1-5, because, you know, the day wasn't already challenging enough so why not up the ante by preaching from perhaps the most difficult book of the Bible! (What was I thinking?!?!) Nevertheless, it was God's word for that day for it gave us a glimpse of the vision for the Church—to be encouraged, empowered, and motivated to keep going no matter the adversity, struggle, or challenges—especially in a world where God seems absent. That was what the church in Revelation struggled with, and that same struggle can infect our thoughts today—which is why we started with Revelation thirteen years ago. We as a church have work and ministry to tend to, and we must find hope and encouragement and empowerment and be reminded that though the world seems determined to destroy itself, God is in fact still creating, God is still making all things new, God has not given up, and neither should we, because that is the role of the Church—to bring and share and show the Good News that God is at work, and God's work is always for good.

During that sermon I shared for the first time the story my missionary friend Elena Huegal always shares, the story of the little stone, which I have shared several times since, each time passing out a little stone at the end of the service as a reminder we are all God's little stones, and God will surely use us to bring down the giants of today.

As I look back on the last thirteen years, I can see clearly how God has worked in us and through us to be God's little stones to make a difference by bringing down many a giant. God has blessed us, and in turn used us to bless others, through our work, ministry, and mission. I have been amazed to see how we as a church have opened wide our doors, how we have sought to give more than we have received, how we have allowed ourselves to dream dreams and follow faithfully a God given vision of loving God and our neighbor as ourselves. Everything I have had the honor and privilege to see, lead, and be a part of over the last thirteen years is evidence that First Christian Church of Stow permits God's River of Life to flow freely through us, allowing its waters to wash over each of us in transformative and difference making ways.

For all of it I give thanks to God. For each of you, and for all the Saints we have had to say goodbye to in this life, I give thanks to God. For the chance and the blessing to be your pastor, I give thanks to God. And on behalf of Julie, Violet, and A.J., we thank each of you for embracing us as members of this church family. It is truly an honor and a privilege to serve as your pastor and to serve along with you as we seek to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. I can't wait to see what God will do in and through us in the years ahead.


### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

### <u>Loaves & Fishes + Pantry</u> <u>October Report</u>

Our Loaves & Fishes + Pantry continued to grow in October. We served 105 meals of Ham, Scalloped Potatoes and Green Beans.

Our next Loaves & Fishes + Pantry will take place on November 20 from 4-6 p.m. The Drive Thru Meal will have yummy turkey casserole, green beans, applesauce and a roll.

This chart shows our increased over the past four months. As you can we had a big jump from July to August and then a slow but steady increase.



We have every reason to believe that this increase will continue. In October we had 6 families visiting us for the first time.

We provided groceries for 32 seniors, 47 adults and 25 children. Each family received 5 bags of groceries including (but not limited to) potato chips and breads and peanut butter and canned veggies and beef ravioli as well as laundry detergent and cleaning supplies. As always, the people receiving the meals and groceries are universally grateful to our church for providing this free service.

### **Bonus Pastor's Pen!**"No-Shave November"

Things are about to get hairy around the church because once again it is *No Shave November!*—a month-long journey during which participants forgo shaving and grooming in order to evoke conversation and raise cancer awareness.

No-Shave November has been a tradition for years as November marks the beginning of the cold weather months. In 2009, after their father passed away from colon cancer, the eight children of Matthew Hill decided to reinvent the activity to raise awareness and money for charity by encouraging folks to forgo shaving and donate the dollars saved to cancer charities.

In July of 2017 I lost my Dad to colon cancer. But my Dad wasn't the only person in my life affected and impacted by cancer. There are others—too many others. And I know each of you have a loved one who has been impacted by cancer. I know too, many of you have fought, or continue to fight, a battle with cancer. And so this is just one small way I am acknowledging, remembering, and honoring those who I

know and love who have been impacted by this awful disease. Not to mention it gets people talking about wild and hairy issues, like for instance, "Why is the pastor looking so scruffy?" Which can be responded to by saying, "Oh, that's because he's participating in 'No-Shave November' which seeks to create a broader awareness to cancer prevention, help save lives, and aid those fighting the battle of cancer."

November is a time to reap and gather; a time to remember and give thanks; a time to celebrate all that is good around us—most especially the abundance that comes from God. And November is a time, for me at least, to embrace the *hairiness* of life. So if things get a bit too hairy for you, or if they are too un-kept for what you think a pastor ought to look, I hope you will take a second to remind yourself that in the hairiness of life, there is love to be found. #### **Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team**

#### Financial Giving from the Congregation through October 2022

We won't close the financial books for October for a couple more days, but I wanted to provide a status of where we are currently with our congregational giving. The numbers below are not final but I believe they are a close estimate of the final numbers.

The Total Income **budget** amount is \$23,203 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

For the month of October, so far, our **actual** income is \$28,519. For the month this is above the budget amount by \$5,316. A large amount of that overage is money received for our Christmas Ingathering, which we still consider Income. But even if we adjust for that, the income received towards our Operating Expenses is still positive and above our budgeted amount for the month. Because of this increase in October, our YTD numbers have also improved. Though we are still below budget overall, the YTD shortage is a smaller percentage, where at the end of September we were 4.6% below budget overall, now we are only 1.5% below budget overall for Income. We are truly blessed as a congregation!

As we shared last December, the budget approved by the Governing Board and the congregation for 2022 has the total expenses higher than the total income. We refer to that gap as our Leap of Faith, with the hopeful expectation that throughout the year we will be able to both increase our income and control our expenses appropriately.

The 2022 Leap of Faith amount is \$19,481 for the full year, which is 7% above our budget income.

if you personally are feeling financially stable and would like to make an additional gift to the church above your normal giving, those are always appreciated. Any increases will help position us to be able to increase the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both local and globally.
