January 2024 Pastor's Pen

Is it just me or is life speeding up every year? Every year I think, "Is it really (fill in the year)? Am I really turning ## this year!?" You might have similar thoughts—maybe not at the New Year, but sometime throughout it I suspect, because we humans tend to race through life without even having time to catch our breath, or barely have time to eat or use the bathroom, until something jumps up and reminds us of the year, our age, or something that makes us shockingly aware of reality. (And personally, I have found when it comes to raising kids, the years fly even more incredibly fast.)

Still though, whether you are a parent or not, or if your kids are now raising their own kids, life shows no signs of slowing down for us, which is not healthy for our minds, bodies, or spirits. And the research to back this truth up is well established, showing that when we move through life at a high rate of speed for too long without slowing down, we end up living in a constant state of low-grade fight-or-flight. Our stress and cortisol levels increase. Good thinking and problem solving degrade substantially because we are just trying to survive. All of this means then, if we are headed in the wrong direction, continuing at a high rate of speed will only take us further away from where we want to go.

Bottom line... Life isn't going to slow down for us. Which means, we have to "get out of the fast lane, pull over, and study a map."

Clinical psychologist, Dr. Parker Houston speaks to this concept of getting out of the fast lane, pulling over, and studying a map in his blog, writing, "Every year, my wife and I set aside one full day to spend together looking at our Life Plans from the prior year, assessing how we did in following it, and then writing a new plan for the upcoming year. We discuss our annual calendar, personal goals, our financial plan, parenting strategies, vacations, health issues, and anything else that might require our attention. This is a great activity to do with your partner to learn about what they want and ensure you are on the same page with the big stuff.

Some common life plan areas or accounts include: health (mental and physical), finances,

marriage/relationship, parenting, spirituality, work/professional, fun/hobbies, friends/family, and personal growth. But don't be limited to just these, find the ones that work for you. Next, craft your life plan, writing a vision statement for each area and identifying goals for each. Pro tip though, the more goals you set, the less your chances of achieving them, so pick your most important and realize you cannot do every life goal this year.

Dr. Houston concludes his "Life Plan" encouragement saying, "A life plan is like a road map or GPS. You pick the destination, then follow the instructions to stay on course. If you hit a roadblock, you are re-routed so you can still arrive at your intended destination. But you must enter the coordinates, or it won't take you there. And we must keep looking at and listening to the GPS or map in order to arrive. But a map or GPS will only help you if you have a destination in mind."

With so many choices in the modern world, we need a way to stay focused on what is most important, a way to prioritize what to spend our time on. The options today are virtually limitless and overwhelming. A life plan, a vision, an open heart to what God is calling you to do and be can help you get a clear perspective on life's nonnegotiables and avoid the painful sting of regret while also setting you up for service to God and God's children that will inevitably fill your heart, and the hearts of others, with the hope, peace, joy, and love of God.

Yes we are all busy. Yes, the days, weeks, months, and year go by in a flash. But none of that means we must forgo living out our core values or living the life that will bring us and those we love joy and happiness, the meeting of priorities, the making of cherished memories, and love. So, let's stop making excuses. Let's decide right now that we will go a different way, follow a different plan, and achieve a better outcome before the ball drops on 2024. Let's not go rushing into this new year at the same frantic pace. Let's pull over, check the map, and proceed along the road God wants us to take. Happy New Year everyone.

Loaves & Fishes + Pantry 2023 <u>Recap</u>

December capped off a tremendous year for our Loaves & Fishes + Pantry. During 2023 we served 545 families consisting of 1,474 individuals. Compare that to 2022 when we served 370 families consisting of 959 people.

You read that right: we had a 47% increase in families served and a 53% increase in people served.

In 2023 we spent \$3,584 on grocery items at the Food Bank, which works out \$2.43 for each person who received groceries.

One senior couple who came in December said that they usually make our groceries last 3 weeks; our groceries are a big help for those who come to us in need.

Let's not forget all the donated paper towels and toilet paper. It would have cost us \$295 dollars to buy a similar amount of paper products from the Food Bank. Plus, let's be frank, the quality of paper towels and toilet paper that you donated was better than the generic stuff available at the Food Bank.

This was all made possible by your support...your prayers, your donations, and your time volunteering.

With your continued support we look forward to successful 2024.

The 2023 Ingathering program was another success. I want to thank all of you who participated/supported this amazing ministry. Whether you donated food, money, or time; went shopping for food or gifts, wrapped gifts, bagged gifts, baked cookies, put food boxes together, put cookie plates together, picked up gifts, delivered gifts, delivered blankets, bought and organized coats or socks and underwear, donated used items, made scarfs, tied blankets, broke down boxes, put bikes together or any number of other things that make Ingathering amazing - WE THANK YOU. It is truly an entire church and community outreach. A special thank you to our outside sponsors - please acknowledge the generosity of Marhofer Chevrolet, Cascade Imports, Redmon Funeral Home, Harvest Realty, and Hudson United Methodist Preschool. Through your generosity, we provided a very special holiday for 54 families that would otherwise have very limited reason to celebrate.

While we often do not hear back directly from families served, we do get glimpses of the struggles that some are facing: a couple examples from that night included a family that was unable to pick up their items because everyone in the family was sick, and a family that was unable to come because Mom was in the hospital. (We were happy to deliver their items to their homes.) We are confident that our Ingathering program does provide vital assistance to the families and their children at this point in their lives. A little hope can go a long way to improve the life of a family that is struggling. Thank you for helping us to provide a little hope to the 54 families served-families which included 110 children. We distributed over 85 coats, and 128 fleece blankets in addition to the 54 food boxes with Aldi gift cards and gifts for those 110 children. Your support is what makes this ministry happen. Thank you and may God bless all who make this ministry so amazing!

Cascade Auto Group's Support of The Ingathering Outreach

In an effort to help local families in need, Cascade Auto Group has purchased toys for children in connection with the Christmas Ingathering Outreach program of the First Christian Church of Stow. This is the 16th year Cascade has participated in the outreach program.

The program assists families in need by providing Christmas presents for children and adults as well as gift certificates to grocery stores to help families get through the holidays.

Ann Halpin, ministry coordinator, said 112 children from 44 families will receive gifts this year. Another ten families will receive food baskets and gift cards.

Many Cascade employees make a cash donation to the program, and the funds raised are matched dollar for dollar by Cascade Auto Group owners. The money collected is used to sponsor families, some of whom have five children, for Christmas.

Pat Primm, owner and Internet marketing manager, explains how the program works. "We do not know the identity of the families, but we're given guidance as to what the kids want, their ages, clothing sizes if appropriate, and things like that," he said. Cascade also buys presents for the parents to further enhance the Christmas spirit. Cascade's employees who volunteer for the program shop for the families, and then follow it up with a gift-wrapping party in the Mazda showroom. "The participation we get is incredible," continued Pat, "and staffers really get excited to be part of this gift-giving program." Cascade delivers the wrapped presents to the church, which then distributes them to the families in need. This year's distribution date is December 19.

"We're pleased and proud to participate in this program for the past 16 years," said Pat. "A key focus of our mission is to be a positive force in our community. What could be more at the heart of that mission than to help children and families that are struggling at Christmas? It's the right thing to do."
