<u>Pastor's Pen,</u> February, 2024

We Disciples are a practical people. We like to do things—build, teach, repair, clean, counsel, work. This desire to "do" carries over into many elements of our life together as church and it provides a powerful motivation for engaging in mission. We look for projects where we can be useful. A common mistake is made, however, when we think that whatever it is we are doing is in fact the purpose of the mission. This is especially true of Mission Trips, where our desire to help others puts us at risk for missing the point.

Building or repairing houses, teaching Bible school, planting a community garden, or exposing ourselves to another culture are all worthwhile tasks. And they are all tasks volunteers can do. Volunteers can show up at a soup kitchen and prepare mashed potatoes or ladle soup into bowls. Volunteers can swing a hammer or work a paint brush. Volunteers can do all kinds of things, great and small. Then volunteers can go home and feel good about the doing that was done and maybe start looking for the next task to do.

To be clear, volunteering is not in itself a bad thing. But we Disciples are called to something more than volunteer some time here and there and go home and feel good about ourselves. We as Disciples are a people of faith, and we are called to serve. At its best, volunteering addresses immediate needs and eases suffering. But volunteering doesn't ask us to do a whole lot more than the task at hand. Serving, however, addresses immediate needs and it pushes us further, compelling us to ask why those needs exist. Volunteering lends itself to relationships of inequality where the volunteer gives and the other person receives. Serving recognizes that relationships matter, and it requires us to be in community with those with whom we labor. Volunteering is something we can choose to do, on our terms, at our own time. Serving is something we are called by God to do, on God's terms and at God's time.

This February we are once again focusing on our *WeekS of Compassion* fund raising campaign to support the disaster relief and refugee entity of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) denomination. We do this year after year, and year after year all of you continue to support this ministry generously. And now this year we are looking to take our support and partnership and service to a new level by considering an allchurch Mission Trip opportunity for this coming June.

Hopefully by now you have heard that we are exploring who is interested and available to be part of a Mission Trip to parts of Kentucky still trying to recover from flooding. We are looking at the week of June 9th to 15th or June 16th to 22nd. There is more information about what this mission trip could include in this issue of the Pathways newsletter, or feel free to talk with Jonathan or Charlie Redmon who is a mission site supervisor for Week of Compassion, with years and experience working on and leading folks who take such trips. If you are even just slightly interested, please let me know so we can talk. June is not far away, and if we are going to make this happen, we need to start getting ourselves organized now.

When we move beyond volunteering to serving, we recognize that the task we are performing is not the most important thing. When we move beyond volunteering, we see that it's also not about the good feeling that comes with helping another person – in fact, we see that at it's core, it's not about helping another person at all. It's about our relationship with God: How is God calling me to use the gifts and blessings God has given? Who is God calling me to be in relationship with? What is God doing in my life as I serve in mission? What is God doing in our lives as we serve together?

When we begin to understand our mission as serving, we stop looking for something to "do" and instead look for what God is doing. When we begin to think of ourselves as servants, then we are open to be led by the Spirit, to give from what God has given, to become the hands, the feet, the heart of Jesus.

So how is God calling you to serve?

Ordinary people get to clear away rubble and build up lives after disaster strikes. This is the work of Disaster Relief with Week of Compassion.

A likely destination is Pike County in eastern Kentucky, where residents continue to work towards recovery from the 2022 July Floods. Work could include clean-up and/or rebuilding projects, or support for teams on those tasks. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, the time when followers of Christ commemorate Jesus' post-baptismal, forty days of fasting and temptation in the wilderness as preparation for his ministry to follow. Lent is also the time when followers of Christ strive to prepare ourselves spiritually for the ministry God calls us to through personal introspection, study, prayer, sacrifice, giving something up, or by taking up something such as volunteering/serving or getting involved in a new ministry.

On Wednesday, February 14th the sanctuary will be open and ready to receive any and all for a time of self-guided prayer, meditation, reflection, communion, and an ashen reminder that from ashes we have come, and ashes we will return, yet still by Christ's gracious gift we are given everlasting life. You are welcome to come for as long as you need and like. Please enter quietly as others may already be present.

2024 Summer Camp Schedule <u>At Camp Christian</u>


