Haul out the holly; put up the tree before my spirit falls again. Fill up the stocking, I may be rushing things, but deck the halls again now. For we need a little Christmas, right this very minute, Candles in the window, carols at the spinet. Yes, we need a little Christmas, right this very minute. It hasn't snowed a single flurry, but Santa, dear we're in a hurry... ******

These are the lyrics from the popular Christmas song "We Need a Little Christmas" that originated from Jerry Herman's 1966 Broadway musical Mame, and was first performed by Angela Lansbury. And it's one of my favorite Christmas songs. Well, it has one of my favorite lines from a Christmas song. Typically my rendition goes a little something like this: "Oh we need a little Christmas, right this very minute... (hummm...somethingsomething, humm...) Yes, we need a little Christmas, right this very minute. (Repeat.) Hey, I'm a preacher, not a singer.

I like this song and these specific lyrics because they ring true for me, and I bet they ring true for you too. Don't we all need a little Christmas, right now? And I really mean, *right now*...this <u>very</u> minute. No waiting until December 24th or 25th. No waiting until whenever schedules are right for all the family to get together. I'm talking right now, as you read this. Wouldn't a little Christmas—some really real Christmas (and not the fake-Christmas like Advent Calendars that are actually just Countdown to Christmas calendars) be a good thing? Right now? I think so. So what's stopping us from making a little Christmas happen, right now?

We spend a lot of time and energy getting ready for Christmas, which is good and right. Decorations, cards, cookies, presents, wrapping—all of it is good and jolly. Advent is a season to prepare us for Christmas, to get us ready for the coming of the Messiah, once again. And then Christmas comes. Christmas happens. And all the work and energy have its day, finally. And it is good and right. But what if...maybe...we made a little Christmas happen as we prepare, right now, right this very minute? Could that be good and right too? I think so.

Right now, there are people who aren't getting ready for Christmas because they are simply trying to get through today. And then at the end of today, they are going to be thinking and wondering how they are going to get through tomorrow. It might be a day of loneliness or isolation. It might be a day of pain, anxiety, or fear. It might be a day of anger, regret, or confusion. It might be a day where the phone hasn't rung, again. It might be a good day, but there isn't anyone to share it with. It might be a day of delivering mail and packages, but no one has even said a kind greeting. It might be a day of scanning items at a checkout, and no one has bother asking how their day is going. It might be a day of teaching your kids or grandkids, or tending to those who are sick and injured, and no one has said, "Thanks for all you do." It might be a day that is simply void of Christmas. But what is Christmas? I say it's more than just a day or a season. Christmas is a feeling, an action, even a lifestyle of hope, peace, joy, and love. That is what Christmas is. And I know it is what Jesus, not Santa, brings. And it is what we are called to share...right now.

So let's do it. Let's bring a little Christmas, right now. Pick up the phone. Drop in. Engage in conversation. Express thanks. Ask questions and then listen...really listen. Let's all aim to engage in some kind of act, gesture, word, or situation that will bring a little Christmas... right this very minute. Someone will be glad you did. Merry Christmas everyone!

As expected, we had a huge day on November 19 for Loaves & Fishes + Pantry.

We served a full Thanksgiving meal to 160 people. This is in addition to all the turkey and fixings served at our church dinner earlier in the day. A big special thanks to all the cooks and servers and clean-up crew who worked all day to feed both our church family and our neighbors in need.

We also provided groceries to 59 different families. These families included 44 senior citizens, 75 adults, and 41 children. We also gave out paper towels, toilet paper, laundry detergent, and dog treats. What a blessing to be able to provide all these items to our guests.

December will be another big month because we have Loaves & Fishes + Pantry on Sunday the 17th and then our Ingathering distribution will be on Tuesday and Wednesday the 19th and 20th.

December 17th will be the last day to turn in family presents and food for the Ingathering. Distribution will be Tuesday and Wednesday evening. December 17th 4-6p.m is the drive through meal and Food Bank pick up. Menu will be creamed turkey over mashed potatoes and sides.
