Pastor's Pen: April 2024

How was your eclipse? Did it live up to the hype and your expectations? For me, not only did it live up to the hype, but it exceeded the hype and exceeded my expectations. And let me tell you, it is not at all easy to exceed my expectations. So I don't know about you, but I was absolutely blown away by my eclipse experience. I was not at all prepared for what I saw and felt during those few precious minutes of "totality." It was an absolutely incredible sight to behold, something I've only seen before in pictures, and we all know that though a picture might be worth a thousand words, pictures rarely ever do justice to seeing and experiencing something firsthand. It was truly a moving experience. And it was, for me, a spiritual one as well.

A couple days after the eclipse I was talking with a clergy colleague from Kentucky who also got to see the totality of the eclipse. Both of us naturally started to gravitate toward faith language to talk about the event. I shared with him I have heard people say that totality is almost an "other-worldly" experience, feeling like they are momentarily taken to a different place and allowed to see our solar system from a completely different perspective. My eclipse experience helped me to see and understand now just what they meant. My friend and colleague then shared about how his most impactful moment was during the end of totality when the second "diamond ring" appeared. With strikingly vivid language, he said he felt like he was at the tomb of Jesus, at first simply trying to be attentive to the shimmering light of the sun through the moon's valleys, accentuated by the solar prominences, only to then see how the light of the sun turned a stunning white, allowing the diamond ring to appear. My friend said it was an experience so powerful it made him wonder if it was what the Roman soldiers experienced when the stone was being rolled away from the tomb at the resurrection. From there we talked about our small stature in the universe and how we experienced deep awe and wonder during totality, realizing how tiny we are in God's creation.

I have shared with you before that the more I understand science, the more I see it as just how God's hand of creation is still at work today. Additionally, I am more comfortable with who I am in my smallness, seeing it as affirming my significance, not hindering it. My faith leads to me to take the declaration of belovedness, given to me by Christ, and hold it in contrast to the immensity of the universe and realize... size does not matter when it comes to God. This is quite the opposite in our world though, where depending on how we understand size, yes it does matter—bigger cars, houses, bank accounts, titles, prestige, etc. Yet the goal of the spiritual life is not to increase but decrease, by voluntarily placing ourselves in the lowest place. My friend said to me, "The larger the universe becomes, the more my spiritual life is affirmed." Put another way, the smaller I become in the physical universe, the more I am comforted by the truth that the Creator of the universe knows me, knows my name, knows my pain and sorrows, knows even my sins, and yet still God calls me God's beloved.

My friend and I concluded our conversation, and as I drove on (because we always talk when each of us is driving somewhere) I thought to myself, "How often do we really look to the heavens?" In the literal sense, we look to the heavens as a means for exploration and discovery; a place that beacons us to go where no man or woman has ever gone before. But in the metaphorical sense, looking to the heavens should inspire us to gaze in awe and wonder and take in the beauty of creation, while also striving to gaze in awe and wonder at the heavens so that me might fix our gaze upon God who brought all of creation into existence, while saying to ourselves, reminding ourselves, we are God's holy and beloved children. For if we do such, then we won't have to wait for the next eclipse to look to the heavens and take in an absolutely incredible sight to behold.

Chapel Ceiling Update

Since our last report, Mr. McShane has been working with our insurance adjustor to get his estimates more detailed. Al Naylor has been in periodic contact with the adjustor. We know that insurance is only going to cover the space between the back chapel wall & the chancel area (I assume unless we can show that damage to those areas is due to the collapse.). So, any additional work will have to be covered by the church.

We were also able to determine that the back wall (the one with the stained glass & clock, etc.) is NOT load bearing. The cross beam (like that one that failed) that is about 4 feet inside the chapel from that wall also carries the weight of the steeple! This is the same beam that Mr McShane "temporarily" shored up because it looked like it could slip. After reviewing this with the Architect, we will probably have "columns" or "pillars" against the outside will to help hold this cross beam up. Details coming, along with the rest of the design.
