#### April 2025, Pastor's Pen

Ahhh... the month of April has arrived. Spring is here, finally! And though Northeast Ohio always does its best, as we turn our calendars, to remind us it still has a bit of winter left for us, just turning the calendar to April gives my mind, body, and spirit a sense of relief from the icy, cold grip of the waning season at last loosening from around my soul. And while April brings such a blessing, this April also brings: the blessed conclusion of Lent, Holy Week, and our celebration of our risen Lord and Savior on Easter. This April is set to be special. And yet there's another momentous occasion this April brings! And it's all because the stars and celestial bodies have all uniquely aligned to create for a rare and special time of unity.

This April, and the arrival of spring marks the approach and aligning of three important religious holidays, all coming later than most people are used to. Let me explain, but in no particular order.

First, the date the Catholic/Protestant Easter Day falls every year is based on the Lunar calendar and the Gregorian calendar. The date of Easter is determined by the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox, which this year was on March 20<sup>th</sup>. So using that rubric, this year Easter falls on April 20<sup>th</sup>, one of the latest dates it can be. So the Lunar calendar, with roots in the Gregorian calendar, determines when we celebrate Easter every year.

Next, the Eastern Orthodox Church bases its liturgical year on the Julian calendar, which will typically result in Orthodox Easter Day being set and celebrated a week, or even two weeks later than the Catholic/Protestant Easter Day. The Great Schism of 1054 CE broke communion between the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church, but the major calendar shift didn't happen until 1582 when Pope Gregory XIII introduced the Gregorian Calendar, which the Orthodox Church wanted nothing to do with it. But this year, the Julian Calendar, Gregorian Calendar, and the Lunar Calendars all align and mark Orthodox Easter on April 20<sup>th</sup>.

And lastly, the Jewish calendar is a Lunisolar calendar based on lunar months that begins with the first day of Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year. That New Year's day, then determines when all Jewish holidays will occur—holidays and holy observances like Passover. In Israel, Passover is celebrated for exactly seven days to respect the Hebrews that had to flee their homes for seven days.

Jewish people that live outside of Israel celebrate the holiday for eight days per tradition. And this year, the Jewish celebration of Passover begins at sundown on April 12<sup>th</sup>, and then concludes after nightfall on, you guessed it, April 20<sup>th</sup>.

Yes, often Easter and Passover overlap. And yes, even Orthodox Easter and Passover have at times butted up against each other. But when I tried to find out when they all aligned to be celebrated and conclude their holy days of the season, I couldn't find a reliable source with an answer. What I did find, however, was a quote from Pope Francis who spoke of this rare and special alignment, saying, "This must not be allowed to pass by in vain." Pope Francis has continued to emphasize the sense of opportunity for unity this alignment is creating—particularly with the Eastern Orthodox Church—but also the opportunity for ecumenical unity between all Christians and all Jews by fostering interfaith dialogue, understanding, and yes even unity. All of which is possible, despite our differences, because at the core of our religious and faith traditions is a call, a command to treat all people with dignity, respect, compassion, and love. And so, because these holy days, observances, and celebrations all converge on the same day, we should see it as an opportunity to seek out, find, and discover what we share in common instead of citing our differences as reasons to stay apart.

For all of us, Easter represents the new life we have been given and assured through the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. And that new life can begin this April. It can begin when we seize the opportunities presented to us—by dates on a calendar, happenstance, or when the stars align—and live out the call and command Jesus taught and showed us, and extended love and dignity to our neighbors. We can begin this new life when we strive to find what unites us instead of what divides us.

It's April, and spring is finally here. (As is baseball season!) But this April is set to be even more special and more spectacular than ever before. So let's not allow this month, the stars and celestial bodies, and this special time of unity pass us by. Let us embrace the new life Jesus makes possible and embrace also the blessed opportunities for unity that are uniquely aligning this month. Happy Easter.

### Palm Sunday April 13<sup>th</sup>, 10:30 a.m.

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem was marked by crowds who were preparing for the Jewish Passover, and then flooded the streets waving palm branches and throwing down their coats and cloaks, shouting shouts of "Hosanna, Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" They all hailed Jesus as the messianic king they hoped and believed him to be. This day marks the beginning of Holy Week, Jesus' final agonizing journey to the cross.

You are invited to come and begin this weeklong journey and walk with Jesus, who would use these holy days to teach, preach, command, convict, heal, give, and bless any and all. You are invited to walk with Jesus who willingly suffers and dies so that we might have eternal life. All are invited. All are welcome.

Additionally, a children's palm processional will be done at the beginning of this service. Meet in the Gathering Area just before worship to receive a palm leaf, and then process in during the opening hymn of worship.

### Maundy Thursday Agape Service Thursday, April 17<sup>th</sup> 6 p.m.

Maundy Thursday at First Christian Stow is always a holy and sacred night and is set to be such once again this year as we gather to share in a light meal with one another, and then segue into worship on this holy night, together in Disciples Hall, where the space will once again be transformed into that sacred upper room where Jesus gathered with his Disciples on the night before his crucifixion. There we join with our Savior to share with him a meal intended to fill us up spiritually more than

physically because this meal, like the one Jesus shared with his Disciples, leads to a profound and moving time of worship where the dim setting, impactful music, moving and touching prayers, holy scripture, and living words of institution take on a deeper and more powerful meaning than any other time of the year.

Please plan to make this time of worship part of your Holy Week remembrances and celebration. A light dinner will be served at 6 p.m., followed by worship around 6:35, with an aim to conclude by 7:20 p.m. The Chancel Choir will rehearse after this time of worship.

## **Good Friday Time of Worship** Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 12:05 p.m.

This time of scripture, communal responses, and meditation will take us through the passion narratives found in the Gospels while guiding us in considering and remembering again the sacrifice Jesus made so we would have eternal and everlasting life. You are invited and encouraged to make this part of your Holy Week experience.

This service will begin just a few minutes past noon to give folks time to arrive during their lunch hour, and will conclude before 1 p.m.

### Holy Saturday Prayer Vigil Saturday April 19<sup>th</sup>, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.

The Apostle Paul calls for us to "pray without ceasing." He didn't mean we have to be on our knees or kneeling before a chancel 24/7, but rather that we are open to God's presence with us at all times, and that a prayerful life is what ought to lead us in our daily lives.

As we seek to focus on our Holy Week walk, from the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, to the confusion and fear of Maundy Thursday, to the agony of Good Friday, may we aim to take a part of Holy Saturday to intentionally be in prayer for the new life made possible through the life, death, and soon resurrection of our Savior Jesus.

To do this we invite you to be part of this annual prayer vigil on Saturday, April 19<sup>th</sup>. This prayer-vigil will be held from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., at the church, or in any location of your choosing—your home, a park, a quite spot, or maybe even the front steps of our Chapel where you can let the sounds of the busy road and the people passing by

guide your prayers for our community and the world around us.

Let us join our hearts and minds and spirits together, no matter the distance between us, and go to God in prayer.

### Easter Sunday April 20<sup>th</sup>, 10:30 a.m.

Easter is the great and glorious celebration of the Christian faith that proclaims not only that Jesus is raised from the dead, but that Jesus is Lord of the world! When we declare Christ is our Lord, his victory over death becomes our salvation. As the Apostle Paul proclaimed in Romans 8:39, "There is nothing in life and nothing in death that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord!"
